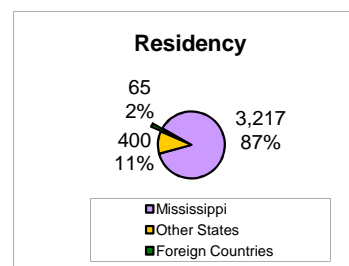
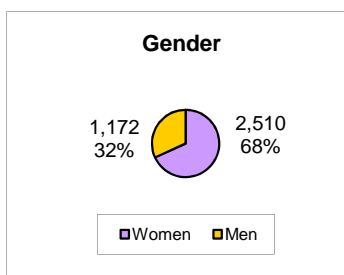
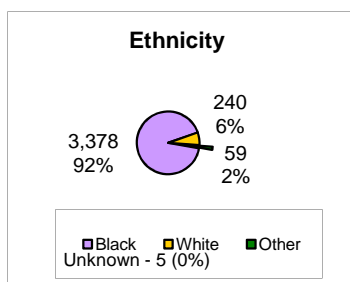
- The first year retention rate of first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen who entered in Fall 2009 and returned in Fall 2010 is 69%.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY PROFILE

TYPE

Alcorn State University is a land-grant, residential University. It is one of eight state-assisted institutions of higher learning in the state of Mississippi.

LOCATION

The University is located in Claiborne County, Mississippi, 7 miles west of Lorman, 17 miles southwest of Port Gibson, and 45 miles south of Vicksburg. State Highway 552, 1 mile north of Lorman, Mississippi, leads directly to the campus.

CAMPUS

The University encompasses 1,756 acres: campus and athletic fields 300 acres; agriculture and research 1,456 acres.

STUDENTS

Headcount enrollment for Fall 2010 was 3,682: 1,172 males, 2,510 females; 2,985 full-time, 697 part-time; 2,980 undergraduates, and 702 graduate students.

FACULTY

Full-time faculty for Fall 2010 totaled 192: 34 professors, 36 associate professors, 71 assistant professors, and 51 instructors, holding 116 doctorates, 1 first professionals, 1 specialists, 74 masters, and 0 bachelor.

DEGREES

621 degrees were awarded in the Spring of 2011: 31 associates, 369 bachelors, 195 masters, and 26 specialists.

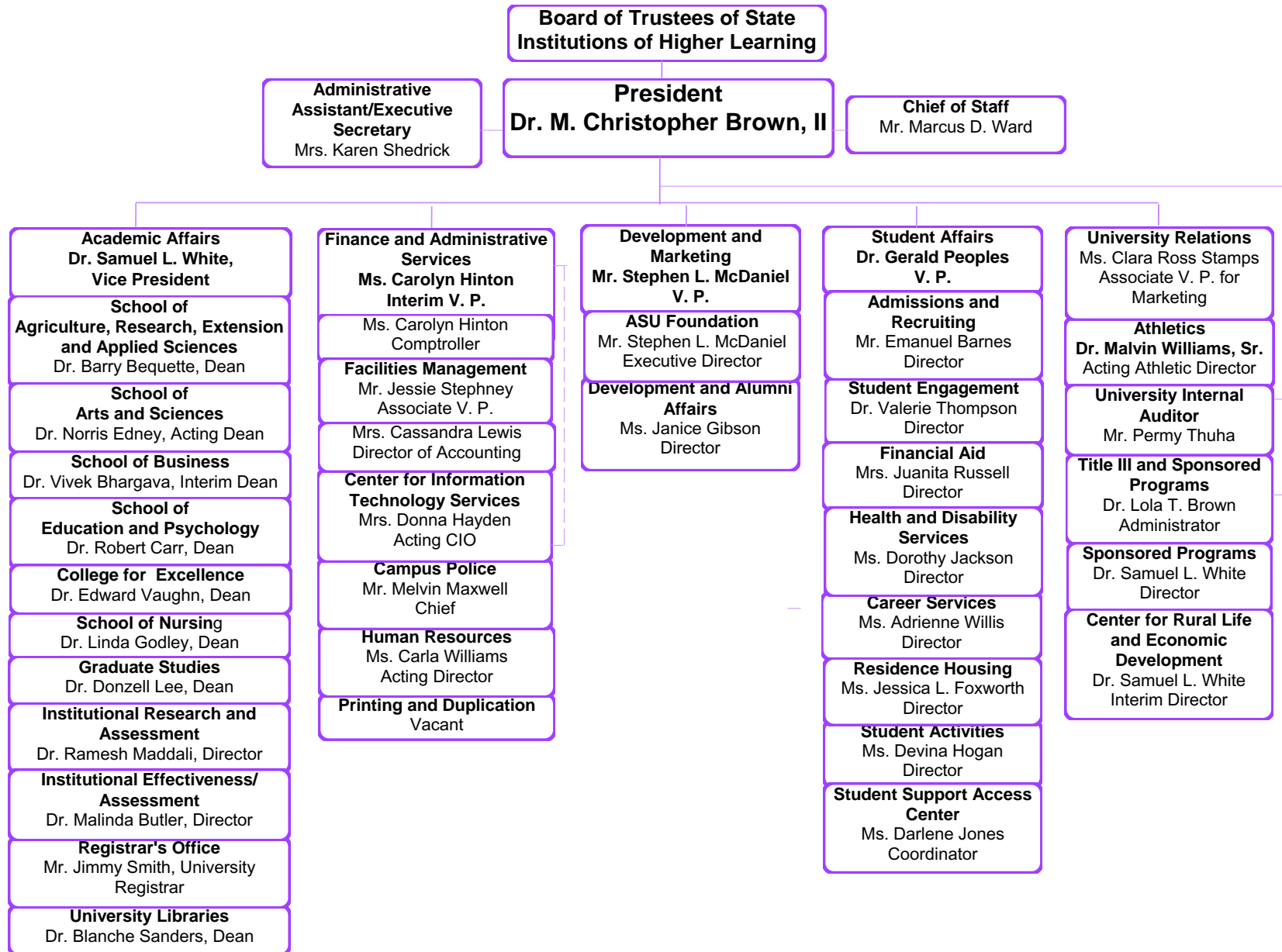

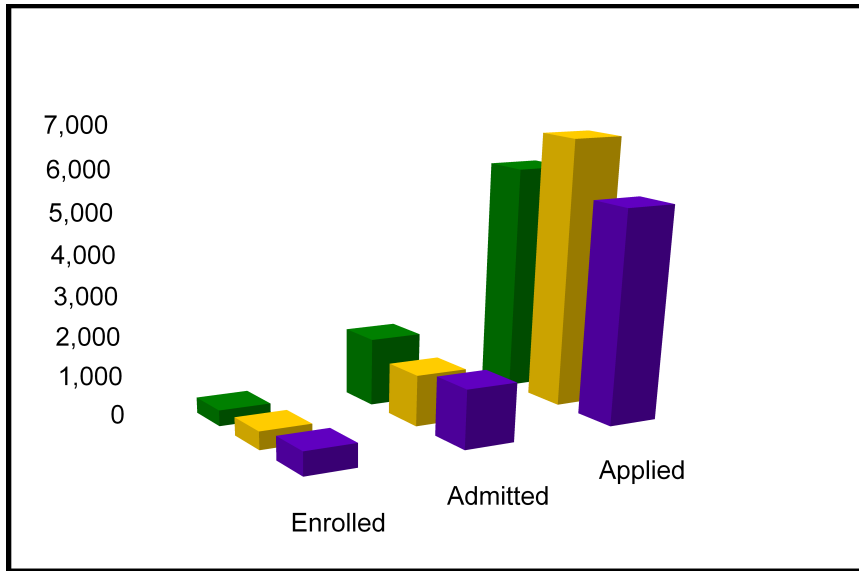
Alcorn State University Organizational Chart

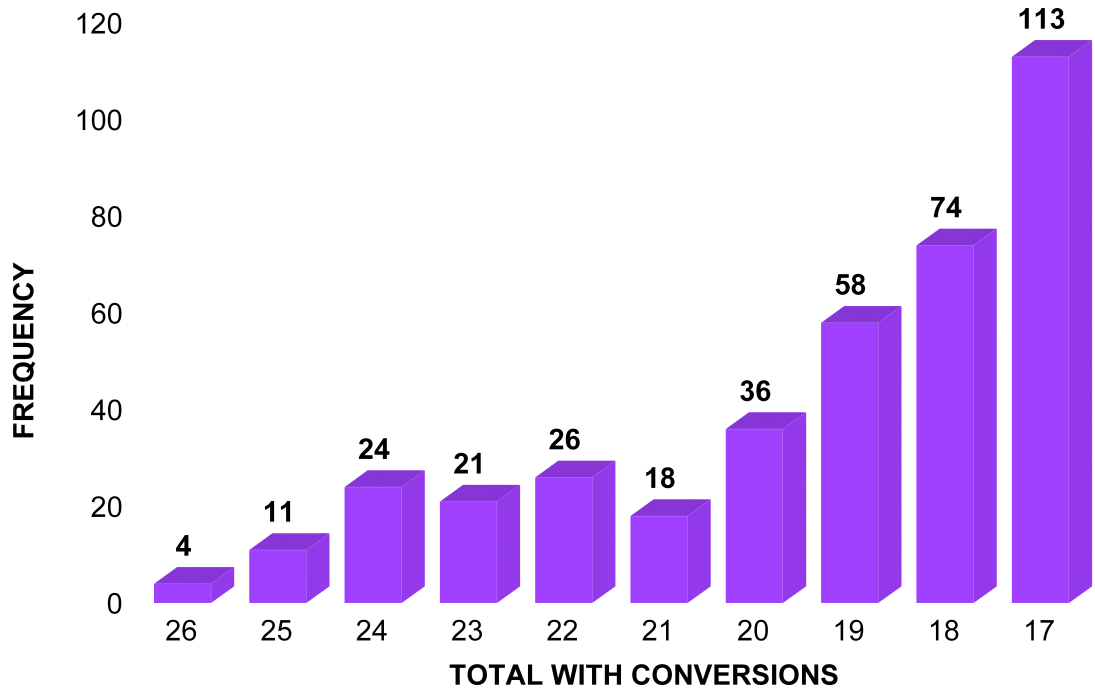

3-YEAR TREND**

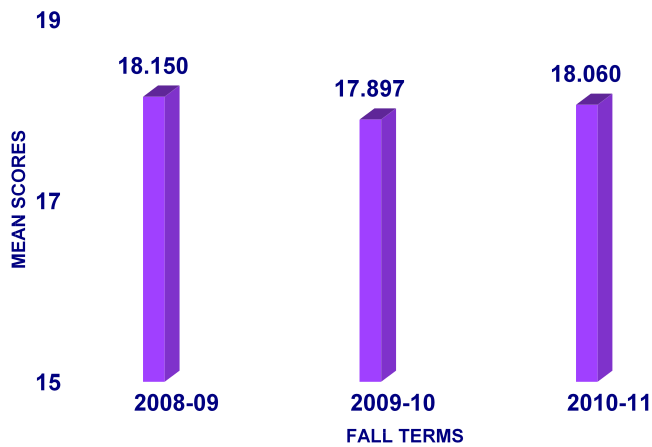

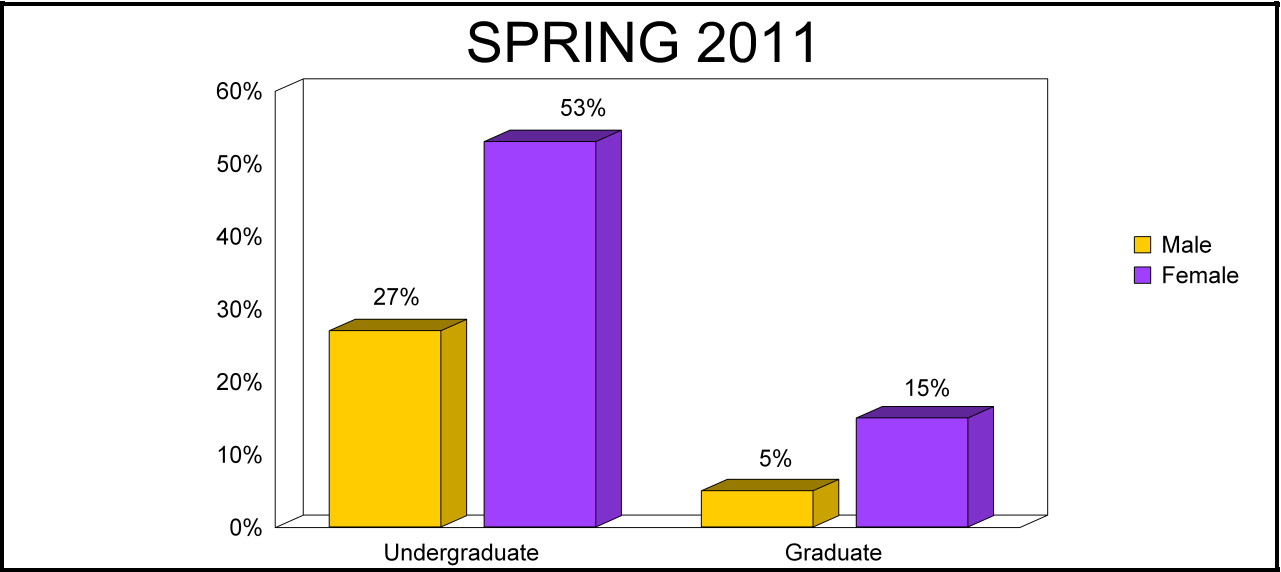
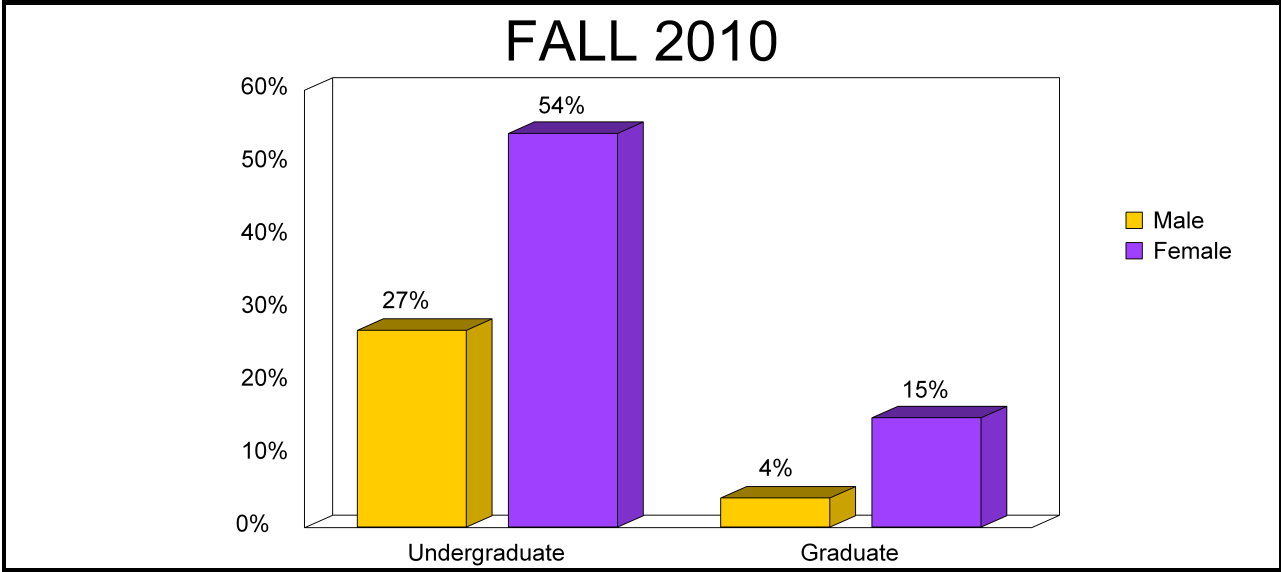

IN-STATE ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY FALL 2010

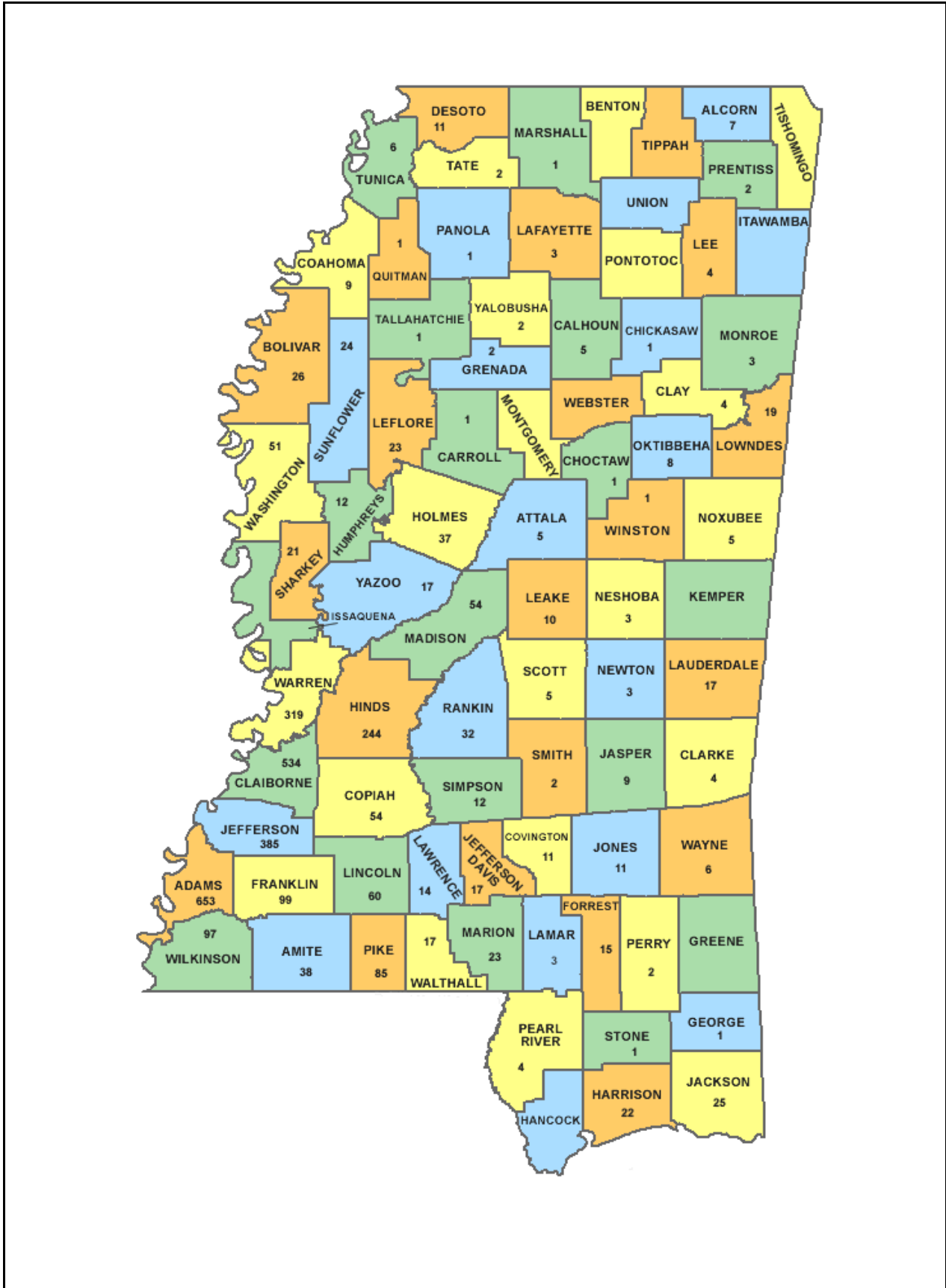

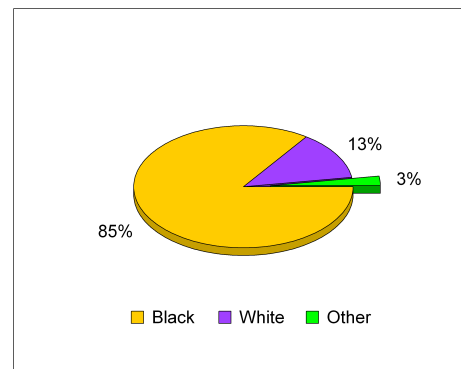

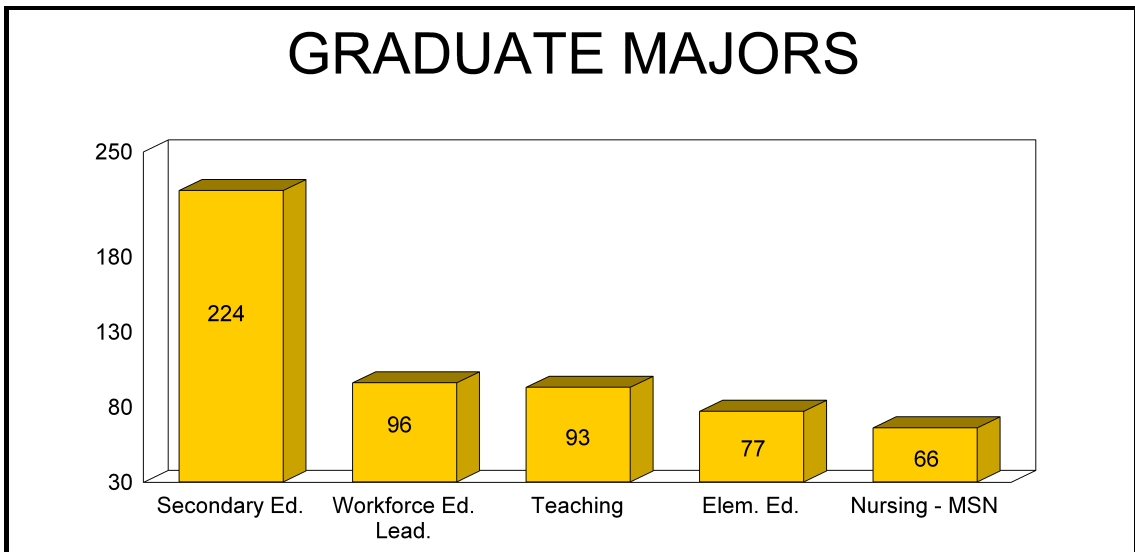

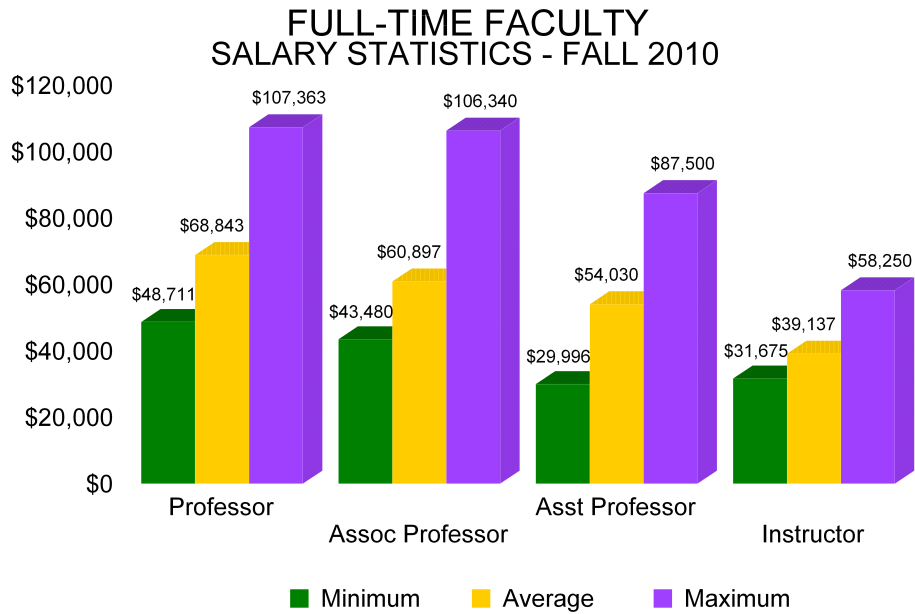

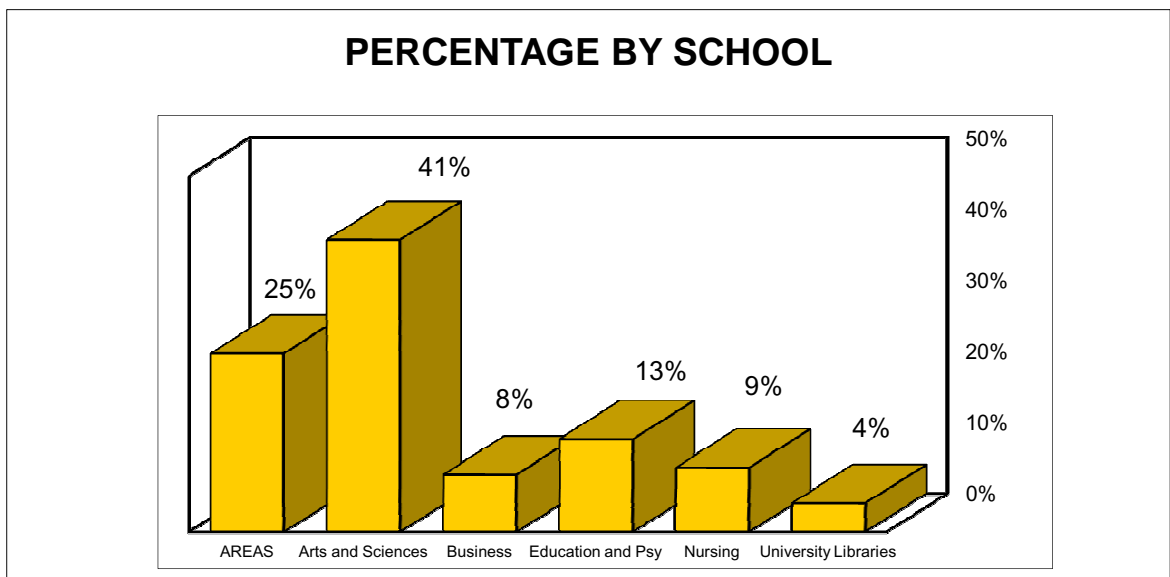

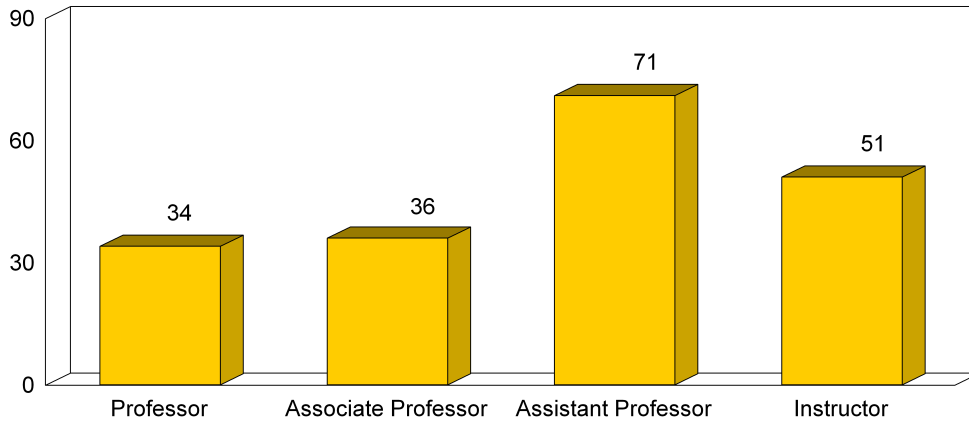

PERCENTAGE BY SCHOOL



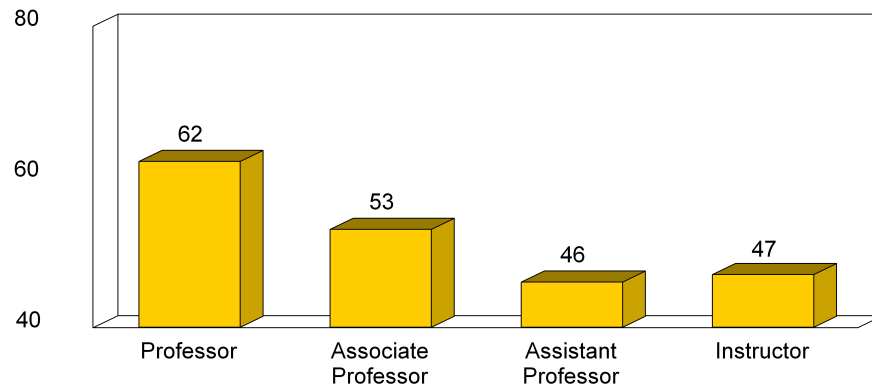

FULL-TIME INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY: PERCENTAGE BY UNIVERSITY



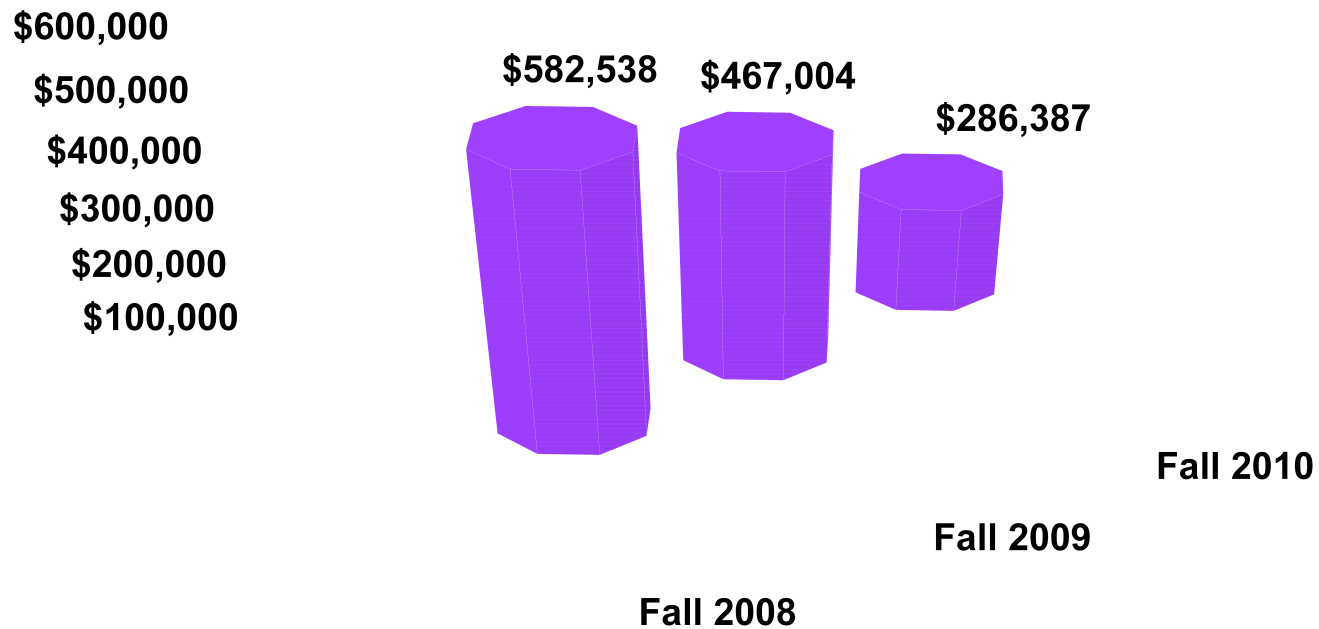

ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY EDUCATIONAL AND GENERAL EXPENDITURES FISCAL YEAR 2010

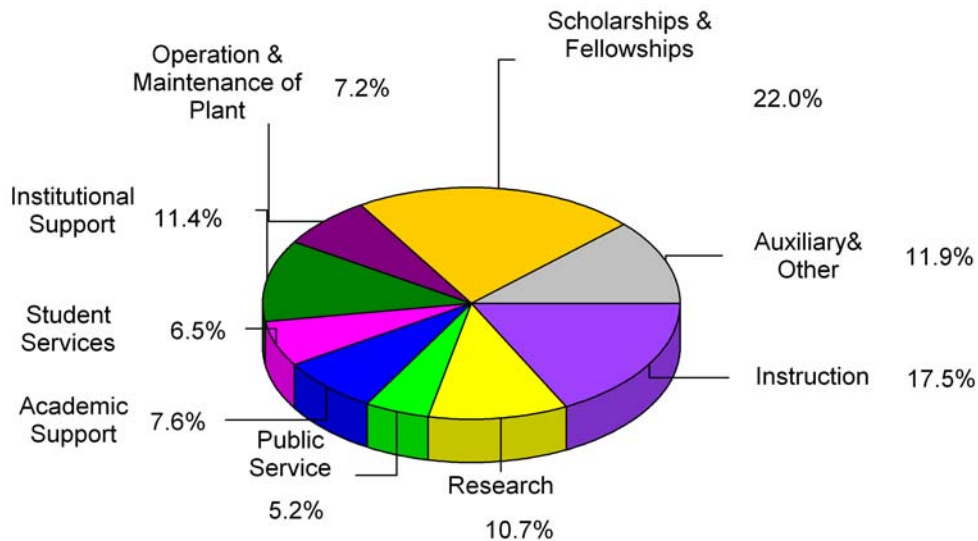

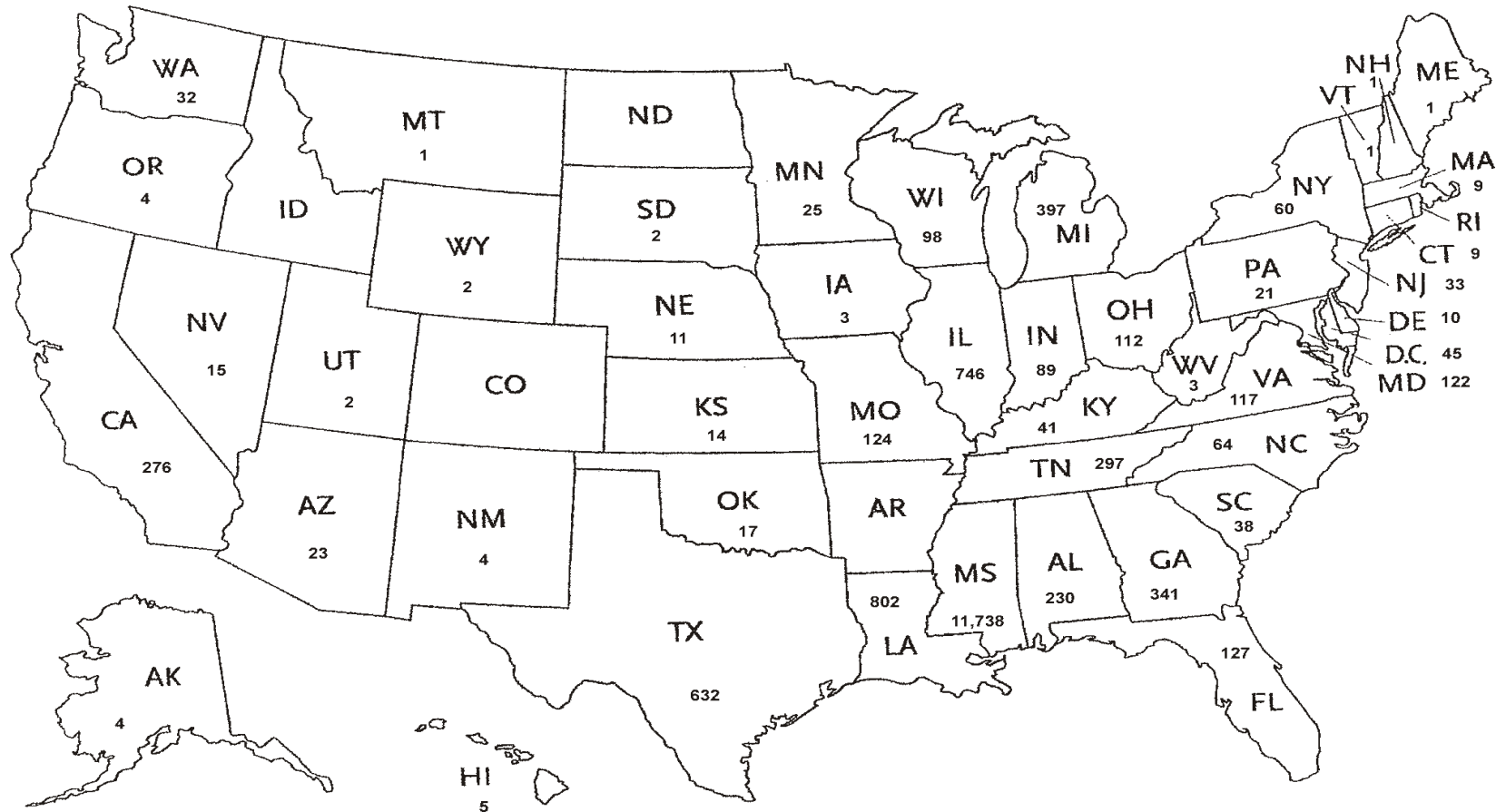

RESIDENCE OF UNIVERSITY ALUMNI 2010

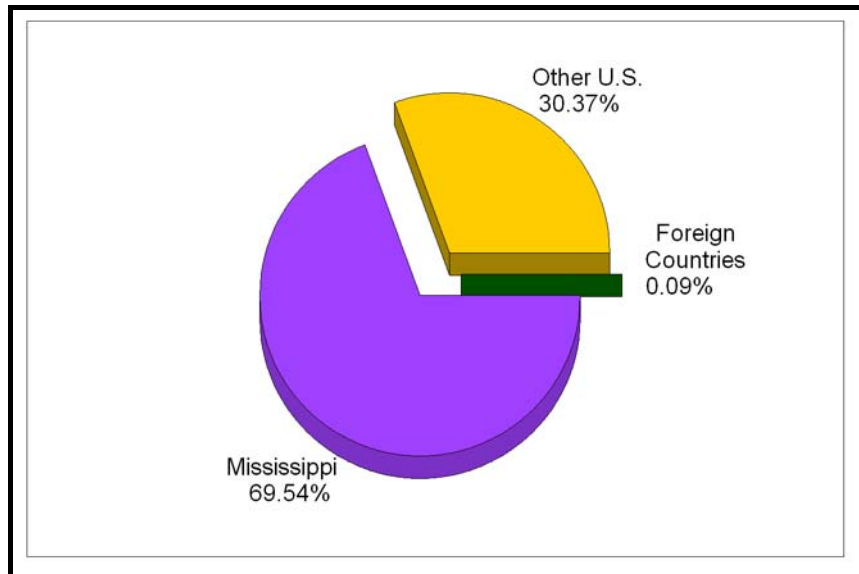

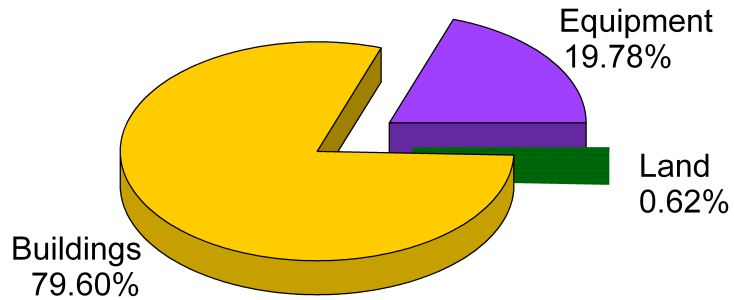
