the history

1885


A Brass Band, is formed at Alcorn under the direction of student J.M. Hicks.



William Grant Still, Sr. became the student leader of this group and later earned the title of "Band Master" due to his skill.



Under Professor H. B. Morton, the band experienced a renaissance with many former WWI veterans now enrolled and participating.

1948 - 1950

The band was reestablished and led by several directors, including Mr. Polite in 1950 and Mr. U.G. Dalton in 1955.

1966 - 1967

The band transitioned to Mr. Smiley with recent graduate Samuel S. Griffin as the assistant director.

1969

Samuel Griffin was officially appointed as the Director of Bands for the "Band of Distinction." Griffin created the first HBCU dance line, the "World Renown Golden Girls," and named the first female drum majorette.

Griffin changed the band's name to the "Sounds of Dyn-O-Mite," which is still used today

Under Dr. Renardo Murray's leadership, the band made its first appearance at the Honda Battle of the Bands.





2018

what Alcorn has to offer.










